We have found a vendor that supplies the 'old style' outside front lights that match our current lights.

If you have a front outside light that is not working, please let David Fedash (Ameri-Tech) or Jim Knapp know, and we will get it repaired or replaced. We are STILL looking for a reasonable priced electrician to do the work. In March, we are going to inventory rear unit light fixtures that need attention and hoses that are laying on the ground that need holders. In the future, we will address both issues.

Birdbaths— fine amenities if you live north of the Mason-Dixon line. In Florida, nothing but mosquito breeding grounds. This is a health and safety issue, so please dispose of these if you have one. If you still have one by the end of March, we will help you do this. Thanks.

We have contacted an exterminator and hope to soon be rid of the 'squirrels in the attic' situation.

Baycut, the new landscape company will be responsible for ALL landscape issues including in-ground pests, fertilization, weed control and fungicide control. Please give us a few months to get caught up to where we really should be—and soon the lawn will look much better. Thank you for your patience.

Lastly, I want to thank each of you who come to the monthly Board Meetings to learn what is happening in your community, support your Board, and be an active part of where you live. We appreciate you.

Please observe the Speed Limit—10 MPH, when driving in our community. We are fortunate to have many 'walkers', and we want to protect them as best we can.

After witnessing the 'old' cleaning company dry mopping the floor without moving any of the chairs, a new cleaning company has been hired — The Green Cleaning Company. Two staff from this company spent seven (7) hours each doing a 'deep clean' in our Clubhouse on March 6. The ceiling fans in the Clubhouse had not been cleaned for eight years. The floor was cleaned, the rug and the chairs were steam cleaned, and the bathrooms are now usable without the odor. The Clubhouse now shines. This became a health priority for the Board.

Speaking of health, the pool Health Inspector on February 22, gave our pool an 'unsatisfactory' rating because our 'flow rate' was below what was required.

This did not mean we had to 'close' the pool. But we did some additional research. It turned out that our Aquatek unit had a defective sensor and was not keeping the water level where it should be. Also, the pool filters had not been cleaned for several months!

We have hired a new pool company—
Triangle Pool Service. The CPO (Certified
Pool Operator) Mike, has spent several
hours with Dick Mall and Jim Knapp on
how to best maintain our pool and associated equipment. The Aquatek unit will be
repaired. The filters will be replaced and
cleaned weekly in the future. And we are
considering purchasing a pool vacuum
cleaner to keep the pool pristine.

Now if we can just keep the ducks OUT!

Buildings and Grounds

February brought the end of our contract with Bay Area Grounds (landscape provider). On March 9th, the Board voted to hire Baycut as our landscape provider. Baycut previously serviced our community in 2016, and did a very good job. We are pleased to have them.

Look for new bushes at Blds 3 & 6, and the mushroom farm at 809 will be history soon.

Two rubber trees (very invasive) were removed, one at 703 and another at 809. The last of the 809 rubber tree will need to be removed by professionals.

The water leak at the rear of 1303 was

repaired after more than two years of ignoring the problem. The excess water usage cost the community a



sizeable amount of money.

The Clubhouse roof was cleaned by H2O, a professional cleaning company. It now sparkles, and goes nicely with the new flowers planted at both the front and rear areas.

Working with our roof vendor Urethane Systems, we will develop a comprehensive roof maintenance plan. On January 18 & 19, Urethane staff walked <u>all</u> 16 of our buildings, and will present us with a report on March 12.



Hanny Barram (Secretary) met with the Green Thumbs group on Friday, March 2, and started planting and landscaping the front of the Clubhouse. Please have a look at the new flowers. Also, both Carol Callahan and Debbie Lamparski have been busy trimming our ligustrum trees and ridding them of parasites. We thank both of you for a job well done.

Area looks cleaner and tidier we will get new things planted there.
