The President's Corner



'A building is only as good as its roof' *Harold Schmitt*, respected farmer

One of the most important projects Pinewood Village faces in 2018, is creating a plan to see that the roofs of our **16** residential buildings are properly and safely maintained. And that involves creating a "**Roof Plan**".

We, as a collective Board, take this project very seriously. We not only want to maintain our roofs, we want to sustain the value of the investment you have made in our community. And as a result of this commitment, we are outlining here our "**Roof Plan**" so that you will know our intentions.

We have hired an independent "roof consultant" who is not affiliated with any roofing company. Chad Cardoza walked our **16** roofs on April 26, and will present us with his findings in May. Here is a summary of the "**Roof Plan**" Get proposal from Urethane Systems (done) Get 2nd independent evaluation (report TBA) Get 3rd independent evaluation (done) Prepare a summary of all 3 evaluations Select a roof method (type) moving forward Create 'bid specifications' for new roofs Have roof companies bid on roofs Select a roof vendor Secure financing, finalize "**Roof Plan**" Begin to repair or replace roofs (on-going) This process (project) will take several years, and we want to do everything we can to avoid costly increases in monthly fees or conduct an 'assessment'.

2018 Major Projects

Develop a Roof Plan (on-going) Clean roof tiles (**May 14**) Fix Building **16** Drainage issue (May-June) Create a colorful landscape (on-going) Use Pest Control — squirrels, termites Replace storage shed doors (on-going) Update lawn areas needing sod (May) Clean carport roofs (on-going) Replace front entrance signs Create wheelchair accessible buildings

Please observe the Speed Limit—10 MPH, when driving in our community.

During a 'walk around the property' we discovered a 'lint trap' that was **very full** of lint. This can pose a **fire hazard** if not cleaned often. Please check your lint trap when you change your clocks—twice a year.
